

SHOW GROUND ADMISSION TERMS & CONDITIONS

FOR

LEMIEUX NATIONAL DRESSAGE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Updated 21/06/18

Please read these Show Ground Admission Terms & Conditions carefully. By attending or being in any way involved in any aspect of the Show, you indicate that you accept and agree to comply with these Show Ground Admission Terms & Conditions.

1. **DEFINITIONS** – In these Terms and Conditions the term “Attendee” refers to any person attending the Show. The term “Show” refers to the event known as the LeMieux National Dressage Championships held at Stoneleigh Park, Warwickshire CV8 2LZ (the “Show Ground”). The term “Organiser” refers to Show Direct Ltd, British Dressage Ltd and all its employees, officers, representatives, volunteers and show officials. The term “Show Secretary” refers to Rachel Moss or such other person as may be appointed to perform such role.
2. **RESPONSIBILITY** – The Organiser shall not under any circumstances be responsible for any loss, injury, illness or damage to (whether or not foreseeable and howsoever caused), or any theft from, any Attendee, any animal, any vehicle, or any other property whatsoever in the Show Ground, provided that nothing shall exclude or limit the Organiser’s liability for the death of or personal injury to any person caused by its negligence or that of its employees or agents.

Any items brought onto the Show Ground or left in vehicles are at the Attendees own risk. Attendees shall take such steps as are necessary to secure their property whilst on the Show Ground.

Attendees are personally responsible for damage to: any buildings, land, equipment, or other property in the Show Ground, or to any third persons caused by themselves.

Attendees will be responsible for reimbursing the Organiser for all liabilities, costs, expenses, damages and losses suffered or incurred by the Organiser arising out of or in connection with any breach of these Terms and Conditions by the Attendee or anyone under the control of the Attendee.

All Children under the age of 17 must be accompanied by a responsible adult and may not be left at the Show unaccompanied.

Attendees are personally responsible for ensuring that they take all necessary measures with regards to health and safety.

Attendees who suffer any injury whilst on the Show Ground must report the injury to the Show Secretary.

Attendees shall comply with any reasonable instructions given to them by the Organiser and / or Stoneleigh Park Ltd.
3. **ADMISSION TICKETS** – It is understood and agreed by Attendees that admission tickets only allow entry to the general public areas of the Show Ground and that some areas of the Show Ground will have restricted access as deemed necessary by the Organiser. In addition, certain areas (for example, but not precluded to, the Nationals Pavilion, Covered Grandstand Seating) will require specific passes for Attendees to access. All uncovered seating is free for Attendees, however; all uncovered seating is unreserved and on a first come basis. The public entrance gate opens at 7.00am and closes 45 minutes after the conclusion of the last prize giving of the day.
4. **ONLINE TICKET SALES** – Tickets for the Show are available for purchase online by visiting the online shop at www.britishdressage.co.uk. These tickets are available to purchase from 22 June 2018, but no tickets will be sent out to Attendees prior to 6 August 2018. A booking fee of £2.50 will be charged per booking made at the online shop. Advance bookings close on 12 September 2018.
5. **TICKET HOTLINE** – Tickets for the Show are available by phoning the Ticket Hotline (07791 318721) from 2 August 2018, between 9.00am – 7.00pm, Monday – Saturday. A booking fee of £2.50 will be charged per booking made on the ticket hotline. Advance bookings close on 12 September 2018.
6. **POSTAL TICKET SALES** – Tickets for the Show are available from 2 August 2018 by sending cheques, made payable to “The National Championships” with a large SAE to: The National Championships, Oakdene Court, Abbeydore, Herefordshire, HR2 0AJ. Advance bookings close on 12 September 2018.
7. **TICKET SALES ON THE GATE** – Admission tickets will be available to purchase daily on the public entrance gate to the Show Ground. Payment on the gate may be made by credit / debit card, cheque or cash.
8. **TICKET PRICES AND AVAILABILITY** – Ticket prices and the availability of tickets may be viewed at www.bdchampionships.com. Attendees understand and agreed that although the Organiser will make reasonable efforts to keep the information at www.bdchampionships.com updated the Organiser cannot, under any circumstances, be held responsible for inaccurate or delayed updating of information.
9. **ADMISSION TICKET CHECKS** – Attendees understand and agree that it is a requirement of the attendance to the Show that they carry their admission tickets and / or wear their admission wristlets and understand that Official Stewards will make random checks on Attendees entering the main arena seating areas.
10. **TIMETABLE** – Although the Organiser will make all reasonable efforts to provide a suitable alternative should there be any alterations to the published timetable; the Organiser reserves the right to cancel, add to, or amend, any competition at the Show, the advertised Show timetable, or any featured participants as they deem appropriate without any liability to the Attendee for any form of compensation.
11. **REPRESENTED CHEQUE** – Any payment that has to be represented to the bank for whatever reason will be subject to a £20.00 administration fee each time it is represented.
12. **VAT RECEIPTS** – All general admission tickets, covered grandstand tickets, nationals pavilion tickets, VIP lunch tickets and camp site passes include VAT. A receipt may be requested from the Organiser at point of purchase. If purchased in advance the request must be accompanied by a SAE.
13. **RE-SALE OF TICKETS** - Tickets are not transferable and their resale for profit or commercial gain (except by the Organiser or the Organisers authorised sub-agents), or use in promotions, or packages without the express permission of the Organiser is prohibited and may render the ticket as void.

14. **DAMAGED TICKETS** – Attendees must produce a valid ticket and / or wristlet to attend Show and removing parts of, damaging or breaking wristlets, defacing or otherwise altering your ticket and / or wristlet may render it void.
15. **REFUND OF TICKETS** – Should a ticket refund be required the Attendee must contact the Ticket Hotline regarding the eligibility for a refund which is available for pre-purchased tickets only before 12 September 2018; those entitled will receive a refund after the show, minus 10% of the price paid, for administration costs. No refund may be applied for after 12 September 2018. The Attendee must check their tickets carefully on receipt and contact the Organiser immediately if they have any queries. The Organiser is not liable for lost, destroyed or stolen tickets and cannot guarantee to replace them.
16. **CANCELLATION OF THE SHOW** - Should the Organiser cancel, reschedule or abandon all or part of the Show the Organiser will not be liable for any compensation whatsoever or damage other than up to a maximum of the official face value of the ticket for that part of the Show that has been cancelled, rescheduled or abandoned.

In the event that the Show is cancelled or rescheduled for whatever reason prior to the start of the first competition on any given day then the official face value of the ticket for that given day and subsequent days if also cancelled will be refunded by the Organiser upon proof of purchase.

The Organiser reserves the right to abandon the Show once any given Show day has commenced the first competition for the day for any reason whatsoever and in such circumstances refunds will be at the sole discretion of the Organiser and dependant on the point of abandonment on that given day.

Attendees must return their ticket or other proof of purchase to the Organiser in order to obtain a refund. No refund will be given without such proof.
17. **LOST PROPERTY** – All lost property during the show will be located at the Secretary's Office. Any inquiries regarding lost property following the conclusion of the Show should be made to Becky at becky@showdirect.co.uk.
18. **ACCESS FOR CARS TO THE SHOW GROUND** – Only cars with the correct car pass will be permitted entry to the Show Ground. All cars without car passes will be parked in the designated free public car park.
19. **ALL VEHICLES** – The Organiser reserves the right to remove any vehicle which is obstructing any access (even if locked and unattended) and the Organiser will not be liable for any injury, loss or damage occasioned by such removal.
20. **VEHICLES REQUIRING TOWING** – Should any vehicle become stuck on soft ground while in the Show Ground or in the Public Car Park the Attendee must contact an official immediately who will arrange for the vehicle to be towed onto hard standing. The Organiser reserves the right to charge the Attendee if, in the opinion of the Organiser, excess damage is done to the ground by the Attendee prior to requesting the towing service or by not waiting for the towing service to arrive. The Organiser will not be liable for any injury, loss or damage howsoever caused while the Organisers agents are in the process of towing any vehicle.
21. **MOTORBIKES, SCOOTERS, BICYCLES AND QUAD BIKES** – Except for authorised official vehicles used by the Organiser, motorbikes, scooters, bicycles or quad bikes are not permitted at the Show. Disability vehicles are permitted.
22. **PUBLIC CAMP SITE ~ ELECTRICAL HOOK UP** – Attendees staying in the official public camp site who book electrical hook up for their vehicles must have a 16amp (blue socket) extension cable to connect to the socket supplied by the Stoneleigh Park Electricians. It is the responsibility of the person providing the accommodation to ensure that all their cables and electrical equipment comply with current electrical regulations. The person supplying the accommodation must ensure that all electrical items in their accommodation have a current PAT Certificate. Whilst the Organiser endeavour to supply the hook up booked the Organiser does not guarantee a constant supply throughout the Show, nor do we accept any responsibility for losses and / or discomfort occurring as a result of a break in the supply provided. Electric is not available for tents.
23. **PUBLIC CAMP SITE ~ GENERATORS** – Attendees staying in the official public camp site may have generators provided they are moderately sized and do not reach noise or emission level whereby, in the opinion of the Organiser, they become a nuisance. The Attendee is responsible to ensure that any generator complies with all health and safety regulations and users must adhere to the re-fuelling procedure set out in the Organiser's document: - P 04 'Re-fuelling vehicles and Equipment' which is available on-site from the Stable Managers Office or in advance by request to the Organiser. All generators must be turned off between the hours of 11.00pm and 8.00am.
24. **PUBLIC CAMP SITE ~ LIQUID PETROLEUM GAS (LPG)** – Bottled gas may be used in conjunction with fitted living accommodation within vehicles sited in the official public camp site; however, it is the responsibility of the Attendee to ensure that all gas bottles are fitted correctly and that all appliances are fitted to the gas bottle through approved pipework.
25. **PUBLIC CAMP SITE ~ FIRE EXTINGUISHERS** – All vehicles staying in the official public camp site must be equipped with an appropriate fire extinguisher to conform to Local Authority Regulations.
26. **SMOKING** – Smoking is not permitted within any building or marquee in the Show Ground, within any designated no smoking areas, or within the stable area.
27. **BARBEQUES** – No barbeques are permitted in the Show Ground.
28. **DOGS** – Dogs are permitted on the Show Ground, but must be kept under control and on a lead at all times. If, in the opinion of the Organiser, any person fails to control their dog/s they may be asked to leave the Show Ground.
29. **PHOTOGRAPHY** – Flash photography is forbidden in or around any of the competition areas.
30. **OFFICIAL PHOTOGRAPHS** – It is understood and agreed by Attendees that any photographs (and / or film footage) taken at the Show by any official photographer may be used by the Organiser for security and / or promotional purposes without payment.
31. **REMOVAL FROM THE SHOW** – The Organiser retains at its absolute discretion the right to decline entry or exclude or remove any person from the Show or future shows without being required to assign any reason or being liable to the Attendee for any compensation.
32. **ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR** – Any act of anti-social behaviour, including excessive noise, will result in those responsible being required to leave the Show.
33. **CASH POINT** – There is no cash point on the show ground.
34. **OTHER TERMS** – If any court declares that any provision of these Terms and Conditions is invalid, unlawful or unenforceable to any extent, the provision will, to that extent, be severed from the remaining terms, which will continue to be valid to the fullest extent permitted by law.

These Terms and Conditions are governed by English law. The Organiser and Attendee both agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.
